Virtual food drive to benefit Taney, Stone, Christian, Ozark, and Douglas county residents

Branson, Missouri – In previous years, you may have seen White River Valley Electric employees at grocery stores collecting cash or food donations. Amid the COVID-19 pandemic, we will be doing the event virtually in partnership with <u>Ozarks Food Harvest</u> and their Stand Against Hunger month.

The Power to Turn Hunger into Hope campaign will run throughout the month of September. All funds raised will support a dedicated pantry in each of our five counties and, with their Ozarks Food Harvest partnership, every dollar provides four meals.
