CEO'S REPORT



We've all heard the phrase, "Don't put all your eggs in one basket." This common phrase is often used in conversation when someone is about to do something foolish or risky. If they take this advice, it means they did not commit to "one basket", but instead hedged their bets with multiple options. Wrapping up financials, reviewing our annual goals, and putting together last year's information to share with the membership - this is the best way I can sum up 2022. We diversified to ensure the reliable delivery of power to your homes and businesses.

Nationally, there is increasing reliance on renewable energy sources at the same time that we're seeing fossil fuel plants taken off-line, often ahead of schedule. We're also seeing more pressure on the electric grid due more frequent and intense weather events, as well as rising electricity demand. Our primary responsibility is to provide electricity to you 24/7 and we need reliable sources of power

that will meet all the peaks and valleys of energy demand. Our power providers maintained a diverse mix of fuel sources -fossil fuels and renewables to ensure reliability, resiliency, and meet that growing demand for electricity. They hedged resources to mitigate future outages, and [at times] even had to purchase energy on the open market when it was cheaper than generating it. Realizing the impact, our providers have looked out for you by testifying to Congress about the capacity shortages our country has been facing.

Reliability also means repairing and replacing utility equipment to prevent wear-and-tear and ensuring our equipment can withstand these events. We saw the highest peak in the history of the Cooperative with winter storm Elliot. From proactively maintaining arrestors, establishing relationships with more vendors to have transformers on-hand, and closely monitoring forecasts to safely shift loads between feeders and substations - we were able to survive the storm with less outages than in previous severe weather events. Creative means or not having all the "eggs in one basket", kept the lights on to your homes and businesses.

While our top priority is providing safe, reliable, and affordable electricity - we also want to be a catalyst for good in our community. We just turned 12 months since the decision was made to extend fiber internet services to our members, because if not for the Cooperative many homes and businesses would continue to struggle to meet the technological demands of everyday life. The five-year project is moving quickly. We look forward to offering fast, reliable internet to our first consumers at the beginning of 2024.
